The right way to sort your load.

- Determine what can be recycled and what is rubbish
- Keep the same materials grouped together
- Pack materials in the order that they'll be dropped off
- Secure your load with a net, ropes and/ or straps.

When arriving at the Waste Transfer Station, your load is checked to see what is being recycled and what is going to landfill. The more recyclables you have, the less you pay. Sort your load to save time, money and reduce waste going to landfill.

Now there's a good SORT!

Before you leave home, **TART** neatly and securely pack your recyclables and waste. Group the same types of materials together so it's easy to drop them in the different bays.

Pack your trailer **RGANISE** or ute to match the order that you'll drop them off. Refer to the map for the order that materials are dropped off as you move around the Waste Transfer Station bays.

ECYCLE Separate your recyclables and waste. There are many materials that can now be recycled.




